

Privacy Policy under Articles 13 and 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) on the Collection of Registration Data

The data are captured

- for the acquisition of the registration data
- for the issue of visitor's cards
- for the collection of the visitor's taxes
- for the collection of the tourism tax

The lawful basis of the processing of the data are § 29 and § 30 of the Federal Registration Act [Bundesmeldegesetz], the German statutes regulating the tourism tax and the statutes regulating the visitor's taxes of the Community of Oberau in conjunction with Article 6, Paragraph 1, Subparagraphs a and c of the GDPR.

Supplementary hints on data protection under Articles 13 and 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR):

The Tourist Information Oberau requires your data to comply with their duties stipulated under § 29 and § 30 of the Federal Registration Act [Bundesmeldegesetz], to levy the visitor's fee and the tourism tax as well as to properly issue the Oberau visitor's cards.

After capture, your data will be stored at the Tourist Information Oberau as long as required with due regard of the statutory retention periods.

Under the General Data Protection Regulation you are have the following rights:

If your personal data are processed, you have the right to obtain information on the data stored with respect to you (Art. 15 GDPR). If inaccurate personal data are processed, you are entitled to have incorrect data rectified (Art. 16 GDPR). If the relevant legal prerequisites exist, you may demand deletion or restriction of processing and file opposition against processing (Arts. 17, 18 and 21 GDPR). If you have consented to data processing or an agreement on data processing exists and data processing is done by automated means, you have a right to data portability where appropriate (Art. 20 GDPR). If you make use of your aforesaid rights, the public authority will examine whether the legal prerequisites are fulfilled. Moreover, there is a right of appeal to be filed at the Data Protection Commissioner for the State of Bavaria.

You are obliged to provide your personal data. This obligation results from § 29(2) and § 30(2) and (3) of the Federal Registration Act [Bundesmeldegesetz].
